ONLINE SAFETY

Enabling our pupils to keep themselves safe online remains a school priority. The online world is an important part of young people's lives and it is important that we give them the skills to do this safely. I though it would be useful to share with you the acronym SMART: -

S: Safe—Keep your personal information safe, don't give away your full name or address for example

M: Meet-Meeting up with someone you know only online can be dangerous so tell an adult

A: Accepting—Be careful what you accept on line it might contain viruses—If you don't know the person who has sent it—don't accept it

R: Reliable—You cannot trust everything you read online. To find reliable information check it out, talk to someone or check in books

T: Tell – Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused

SHERWOOD SPACE

OBSERVATORY:

As part of Nurture 4's Autumn Topic: Our World and Beyond, our young learners have enjoyed a wonderful range of educational experiences. We began with a joint visit to the Sherwood Space Observatory with Nurture 3 to explore planets and our solar system, making lunar models and learning how telescopes work.
