Geography The Geography curriculum at SSSC is designed to enable pupils to become global citizens and develop their knowledge and understanding of both human and physical aspects of the subject. Pupils will develop a knowledge and understanding of their local area and its place within the wider geographical context. Through inspiring pupil's curiosity and fascination of the wider world it will provide essential skills that will prepare pupils for their future. Developing cultural literacy enables pupils to be role models for the future. Through a thematic approach such as climate change, energy, sustainability and fair trade pupils in our nurture groups will be able to relate geographical topics to their everyday lives. At SSSC we implement a progressive Geography curriculum with carefully selected topics and themes that are logically mapped across the school that allow for repetition and for our pupils to become lifelong learners. Topics and themes covered are reviewed annually with curriculum maps visible on the School's website. The nurture pathway is divided into four curriculum approaches and geography is taught thematically through understanding the wider world. The Geography curriculum allows for various cross curricular links and promotes opportunities for communication including current international and national agendas that often support the PSHE curriculum. Pupils have the opportunity to experience Geographical information systems and fieldwork.

Implementation At Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 pupils have a weekly lesson with Key Stage 4 pupils having the opportunity to achieve both an OCR Entry Level and GCSE qualification.

At Key Stage 2 Geography is delivered through a 'Theme' ensuring pupils receive a well-rounded teaching of Humanities.

- To measure progress and pupils' attainment we use a 'Rainbow Grid' with each colour equating to the Primary National Curriculum, with adaptations to suit our curriculum on offer at SSSC.
- Pupils are judged against objectives with a percentage calculated for each stage of the relevant assessment Grid.
- In order to show progress data is collected three times a year, reviewed and evaluated.
- All pupils have individually calculated targets analysing previous attainment and applying a professional judgement to determine a target that is challenging.
