Intent	•	Music at SSSC should inspire pupils to enjoy listening to and performing music to express themselves. Pupils will expand their appreciation of a variety of styles from around the world to motivate and inspire them. Through the opportunity to study a variety of genres and cultural music pupils will develop their curiosity and enjoyment of an art form they can enjoy throughout their lives. Pupils will develop their musical skills and knowledge through a curriculum based in singing, instrument playing and music technology. Opportunities to perform alongside their peers will allow pupils to develop their communication, teamwork and interpersonal skill. Pupils will grow their musical knowledge, develop individual performance styles and an appreciation of music within the wider world.	
Implementation	• • • •	Music at SSSC is shaped around our school ethos of enjoy, achieve, exceed, which allows all students to flourish and become fluent in the art of music Pupils are given the opportunity to study a different topic or theme each half term (once every term in KS3) which is embedded in a spiral curriculum throughout school as they progress through the academic years. Pupils are given continual opportunities to develop their musical knowledge, musical skills, communication and creativity. A music curriculum based around singing, performance and music technology gives pupils a rounded education of different genres, a variety of instruments, cultural music and performance opportunities. Pupils develop a working knowledge of the language of music, they learn to understand and analyse how music is made and played. The music curriculum gives pupils the opportunity to develop a flair for performance and with this their self-confidence, self-worth, analytical skills and interpersonal skills can grow. Working with the Derbyshire Music Partnership to provide KS1 and KS2 pupils with weekly lessons engages pupils in a wonderful range of cultural instruments, singing, signing and performance. In KS4 pupils have the opportunity to develop their abilities and knowledge further by completing a variety of Arts Award qualifications.
